
Greg Fell



Third generation, Director




Jaden Tauren CEO




Jeff Cashen Lead Tiler




VERY SPECIAL KIDS HOUSE


When a child stays at the Sister Margaret Noone Hospice at Very Special Kids House they can have access to a selection of fun, engaging and therapeutic activities. During respite stays, children can utilise the hydrotherapy pool in individualized aquatic physiotherapy sessions. The pool is maintained at 34 degrees and is just over one meter deep, accessible via a hoist or water wheelchair-friendly ramp. Leading health care professionals have noted that Aquatic physiotherapy can foster a sense of freedom, increase independence, reduce stiffness and tension, offer pain relief, strengthen muscles, improve fitness and social interaction. Additionally, it can have a calming effect for children with sensory processing disorders and reduce stress from overstimulation.









HOME OF THE MATILDA'S

The Home of The Matildas, the largest-ever government investment in an Australia-specific football project, is located within the La Trobe University Sports Park. This world-class precinct integrates teaching, research, community participation, and elite sport. The Sports Park features a state-of-the-art recovery and wet area with hot and cold plunge pools, as well as an Endless River pool with swimming jets. The key advantage of the river pool lies in its suitability for resistance training. Dynamic, high-velocity end jets generate a robust river current, propelling athletes through rigorous training regimens. Maintaining a comfortable 28 degrees Celsius, the River Pool provides an optimal training environment, while the pool spa offers a soothing retreat at 34 degrees Celsius. For those seeking a refreshing plunge, the invigorating cold pool awaits at a brisk 10 degrees Celsius.

The facility is designed to accommodate elite-level training and recovery in a wet area featuring three distinct bodies of water: a Cold Pool with a 1-hour turnover, a Hot Pool with a 30-minute turnover, and a River Pool with a 1-hour turnover.







THE INTERLUDE PENTRIDGE

The transformation of Melbourne's historic Pentridge Prison site into a one-billion-dollar dining and entertainment precinct was something of a passion project for the developers. Inside the Victorian bluestone walls is the exclusive underground sanctuary pool for premier guests. Deliberately designed to contrast and complement the 170-year-old heritage site, visitors are treated to a unique experience, offering a space to rest, reflect, and float. Surrounded by candlelight, guests can step into the warm Relaxation Wellness Pool, with a temperature set to provide therapeutic benefits during the experience.

RAELENE BOYLE RETIREMENT VILLAGE

Where community takes centre stage, the pool and therapeutic spa at the Raelene Boyle Retirement Village go beyond mere amenities, fostering a profound sense of togetherness, well-being, exercise, and the tranquility of easy living for its aged care residents. Prioritizing safety in the pool and spa design was paramount. Non-slip "C"- rated swimming pool tiles grace the steps throughout the pool and spa floors, chosen specifically for their safety features, cleanliness, and ease of maintenance. LED lighting is integrated throughout the pool, along with edge tile markings on the pool steps.

Addressing the needs of residents with varying abilities, the swimming pool was meticulously crafted with a focus on accessibility, featuring mobility-compliant handrails that extend just below the waterline into a perimeter activity grab-rail, proving invaluable for programmed group activities. The design also incorporates a DDA-compliant pool hoist for those with limited movement.
